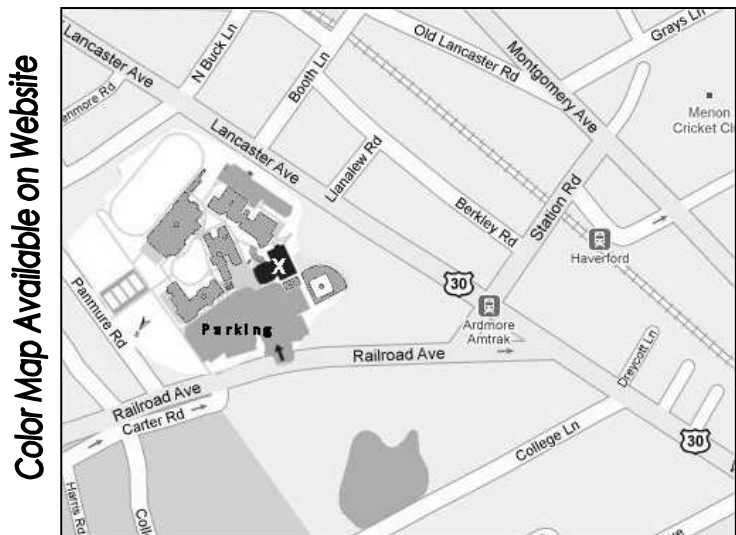
By Car:

From Center City: Take the Route 76 West (Schuylkill Expressway) toward Valley Forge. Approximately 4 miles from Center City, take the left lane exit to City Ave (Rt. 1) heading South. Travel almost 3 miles (past St. Joseph's University on the left) and look for St. Charles Seminary on the right, make a right turn onto Lancaster Ave. (Rt. 30). Travel 3.3 miles through Ardmore and past Haverford College on the left.

From the Airport: Take 1-95 south toward Delaware, exit onto Route 476, follow it north for 12 miles to the Route 30 St. David's Exit (No. 13); turn right onto Route 30 East. Haverford is three miles, on the south side of Route 30.

From the Pa. Turnpike: Exit the Turnpike to the Norristown Exit. Take Route 476 (the Blue Route) South, toward Chester. Get off at the Route 30 St. David's Exit (No. 13); turn right onto Route 30 East. Haverford is three miles, on the south side of Route 30.

From West Chester: Follow Route 3 (West Chester Pike) to Route 476 North. Follow 476 North for 12 miles to the Route 30 St. David's Exit (No. 13); turn right onto Route 30 East. Haverford is three miles, on the south side of Route 30.



Services will be held in Centennial Hall, just off Railroad Ave on the Haverford School Campus. From Lancaster Avenue going west turn left (east turn right) onto Station Road (on the south end of the campus). Make the next right on Railroad Avenue. Turn right into the campus parking lot. Centennial is in the first set of buildings slightly to the right.

By Public Transportation:

SEPTA Regional Transit Train: The Haverford Station is on the R5 Line, a five-minute walk from school. The R5 originates in Downtown and ends in Doylestown, transiting through Suburban Station in Center City.

Norristown High-Speed Line (Route 100): This trolley runs from 69th Street Station to Norristown. There is a stop—Haverford Station, Route 100-0.3 miles from campus.

Parking There is sufficient parking at the school to accommodate Mishkan Shalom's needs. **Disabled parking and access is available.**

Directions to Valley Green for Tashlich for 2nd Day Rosh Hashanah at 4:30 p.m.

From the city come up Lincoln Drive to McCallum Street. Make a left onto McCallum and continue straight, passing Allens Lane and then going over a bridge. Continue straight on McCallum across a bridge. A short distance after you cross the bridge, McCallum veers right. Don't follow McCallum when it turns right, continue straight until you have to turn and make a left on to Wolcott Drive. Follow Wolcott down until the intersection with Valley Green Rd. Make a left on Valley Green Rd. and park either in the parking lot on your right on the way down, or if there is space at the bottom in the Valley Green parking lot next to the Valley Green Inn.

Machzorim (Days of Awe Prayerbooks)

The machzor includes a broad and diverse set of readings, a beautiful gender inclusive English text and transliteration of congregational parts of the service. CHILDCARE for Members & Non-Members

This year Mishkan will not be charging for High Holiday Childcare. Instead, **anyone who would like to put their child(ren) in the childcare coop will need to sign up as a childcare cooperator, for a shift (or find someone to sign-up for a shift in their place).** There will be 2 childcare cooperators assigned to each time slot. Crafts/ games will be provided however it would be great for cooperators to plan an activity (a book, art project, story, dance) for their shift as well, being mindful that there may be anywhere from 1 to 10 children signed up for any period. **Please note that Childcare will only be available on Rosh Hashanah Day 1 from 9-1:15 and on Yom Kippur from 9-2:15.**

Co-operator shifts will be for 1½ hours starting on the hour (i.e. 9-10:30, 10-11:30, etc.) Teens can act as volunteers for one slot on each shift however at least one adult would be needed for each shift. Please be mindful that, for members, being a childcare cooperator does not fulfill your Mishkan High Holiday volunteer obligation.... We still need for you to sign up for those great tasks on Harriet's chart.

All children placed in childcare must have reached their third birthday and be toilet trained. Their parent/guardian must sign them in at drop off and out at pick up. Snacks will be provided and a refrigerator is available for lunches sent on Yom Kippur. Call 215-508-0226 for information.
